3. Identify risk factors that predispose certain populations to poorer outcomes from colorectal cancer
4. List the significance of multiple modalities of colorectal cancer screening (Colonoscopy, FIT, Cologuard, FOBT).
5. Recall the latest updates in research related to colorectal cancer, particularly for underserved populations.
6. Describe the importance of interprofessional collaboration in colorectal cancer screening.
