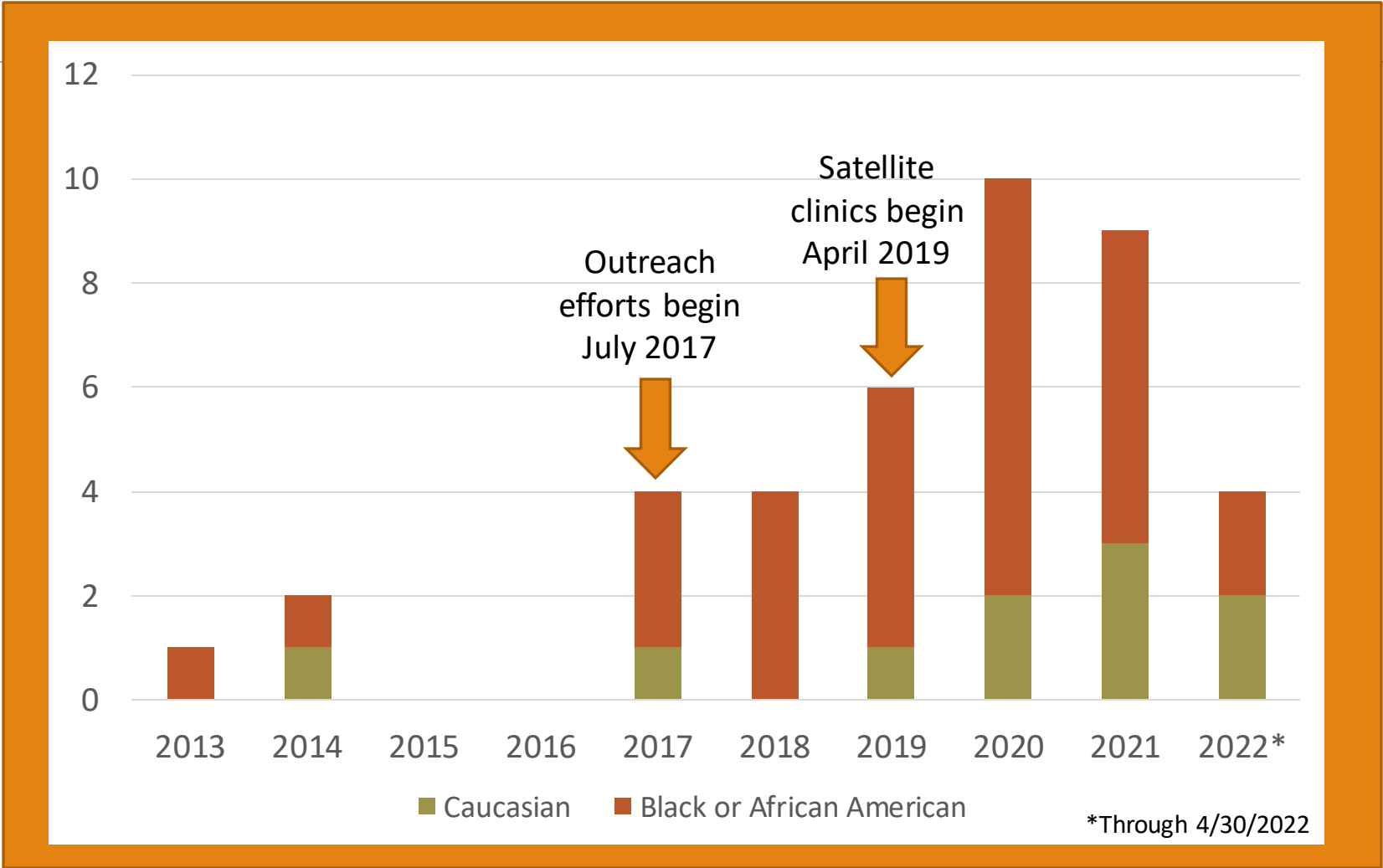

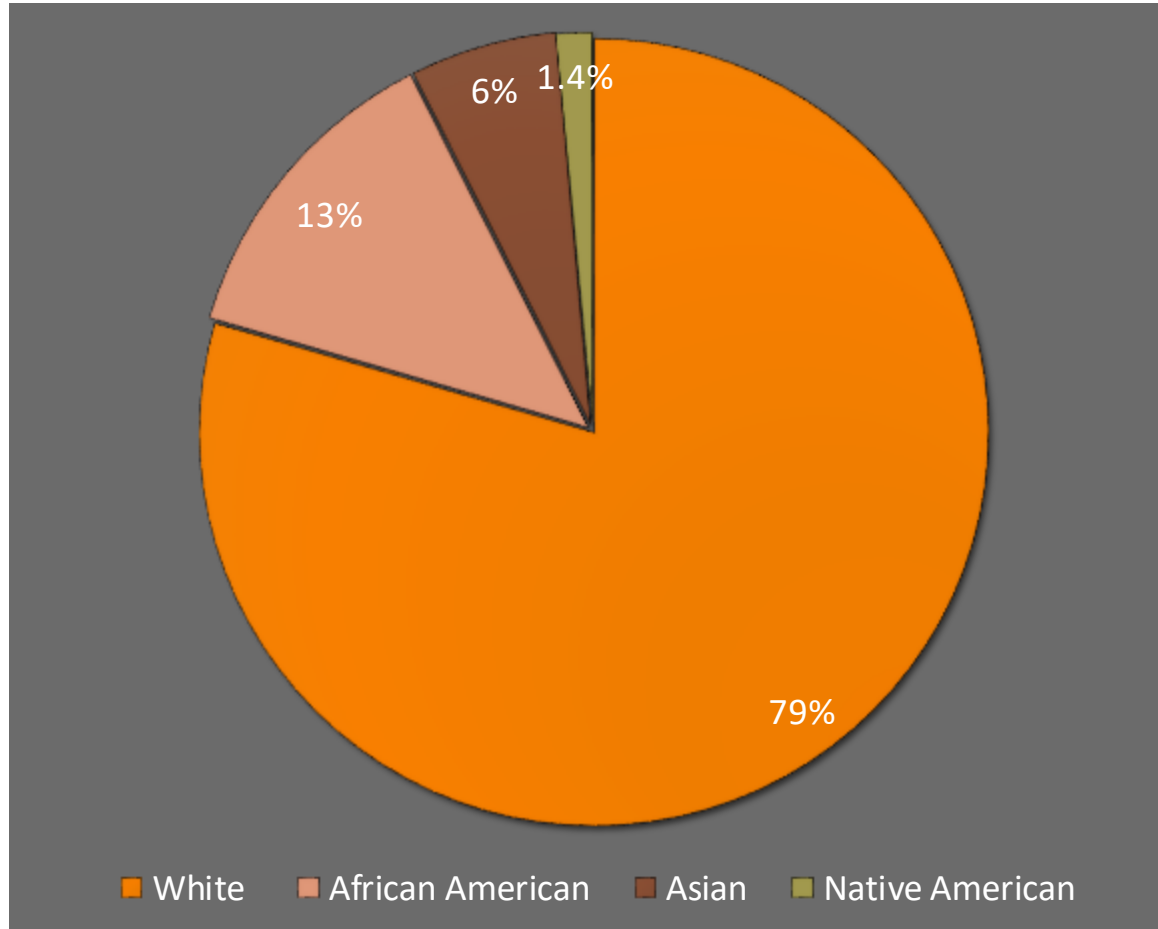


MM Transplants from Satellite Clinics



ECOG/ACRIN 9131 APL Trial Accrual

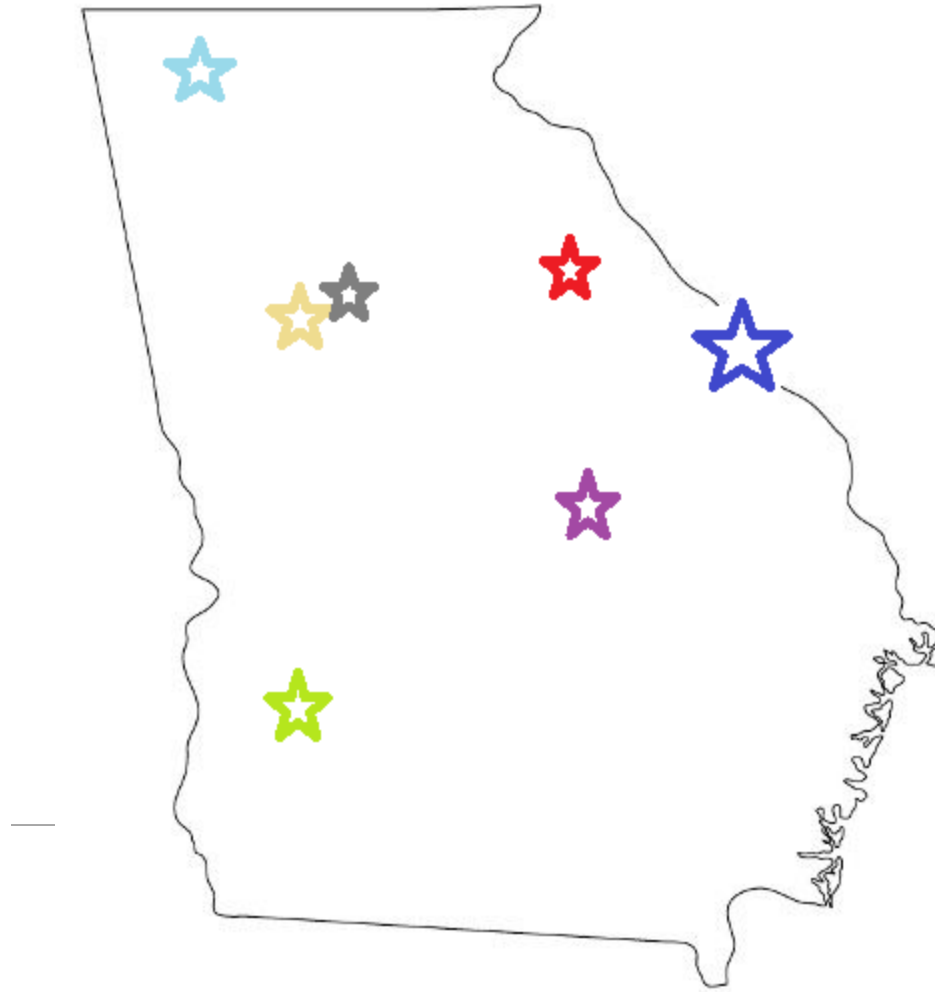
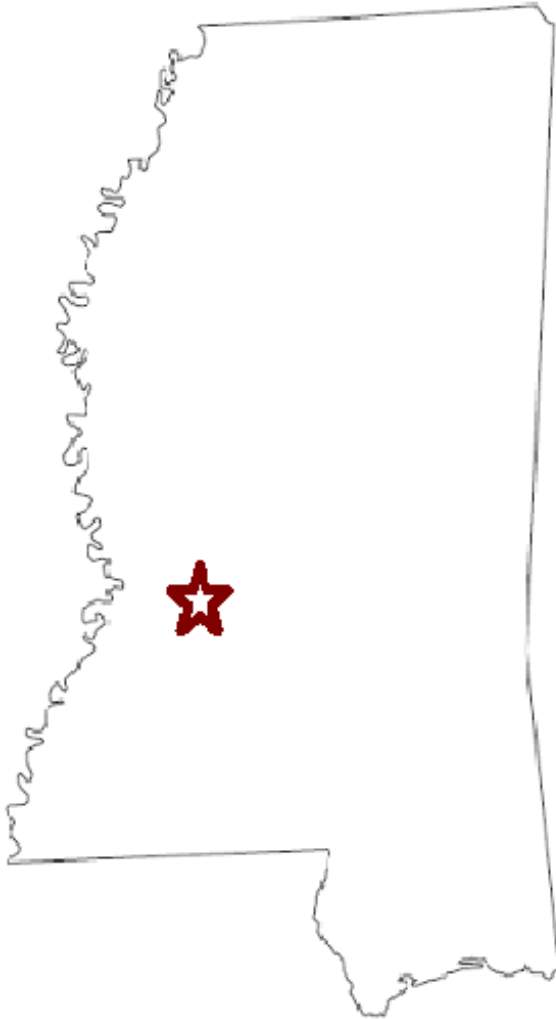

GA CaRes Overview

- ❖ In 2019, the NCI provided Georgia Cancer Center with a six-year grant to lead Georgia CaRes (Georgia Cancer Research) as part of its Community Oncology Program
- ❖ Our program is one of 14 selected Minority and Underserved Cancer Research Programs (total of 46 NCORP programs)
- ❖ Program brings clinical trials— previously available at only large academic medical centers to the people in their community
- ❖ Georgia CaRes makes clinical trials available for every type of cancer in both children and adults
- ❖ Georgia CaRes is overcoming historic barriers by focusing on enrollment of minority and underserved cancer patients

Types of Trials Available through GA CaRes



Minority Accruals for August 1, 2019- July 31, 2020 – Total 176 Patients

❖ Approximately 40-45% annual accrual rate for minorities (last year was 44 %)
